# EMERGENCY CONNECTIVITY FUND (ECF)

- \$7.17 billion one-time pandemic initiative
- Provided 100% funding for laptops/tablets (up to \$400 each) and internet access/hotspots for students and teachers with unmet needs while not on school campus
- 274 PA schools/libraries applied in FY 2021
  - Requested \$132m/\$76.6m committed so far
  - 241,000 laptops and 65,000 internet plans requested



# ECF CHALLENGES

- **Invoicing**
  - Must submit vendor invoice, proof of payment, and proof of shipping or receipt
  - Most BEAR reimbursement requests are missing data
- **Unmet Needs Certifications**
  - Must collect these from beneficiaries of equipment/services
  - ECF audits underway and these will be requested

# FUTURE OF ECF

- Due to processing delays and supply chain challenges, the FCC recently amended rules to extend FY 2021 funding year so applicants have until June 30, 2023 to:
  - Receive laptops/tablets
  - Utilize full recurring services' commitments, up to 12 months
  - Does not extend network buildout timeline
- Window 3 for FY 2022 (7/1/2022 – 6/30/2023)?
  - \$700 million remains. Likely another \$500 million will be unused
  - Another window is likely, although rules of priority could be adjusted



# EMERGENCY BROADBAND BENEFIT (EBB)



- On January 1, 2022, temporary EBB became permanent Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP)
- Provides \$30/month subsidies for internet to low-income homes
  - There is also a one-time \$100 subsidy for a connected device w/small copayment
- Families with at least one student attending a CEP school automatically qualify for ACP benefits, even if the household doesn't meet the income requirements
- Toolkit available with helpful flyers and marketing materials



# E-RATE UPDATE

- FY 2022 Form 471 application window closes March 22
  - 973 FRNs submitted as of 3/9 – 67% in ‘wave ready’ status
  - Wave 1 expected mid-April
  - Use the [Helpful Documents](#) on [www.e-ratepa.org](http://www.e-ratepa.org) website
- Category 2 equipment can be purchased as early as April 1
  - Cannot seek reimbursement until July 1
- C2 supply chain issues from FY 2021? Request SDDE for extra year
- Category 2 budget cycle = FY 2021 – 2025

# FCC BIDDING PORTAL PROPOSAL

- FCC proposing nationwide E-rate bidding portal beginning with FY 2024
- **Mandated Bidding Portal:** Service providers will be required to submit bids to a USAC portal and would be prohibited from submitting bids directly to schools/libraries or other parties
  - Bids would be withheld from schools/libraries until the Form 470 Allowable Contract Date (29 days after the Form 470 is posted) and then released to the applicant for bid evaluation
- **Public, Restricted Vendor Communication:** All correspondence with bidders will be done (anonymously and publicly) in the portal
  - No other vendor communication will be permitted
- **Required Documentation Submission to USAC:** Applicants will be required to upload the following into the bidding portal before submitting the Form 471:
  - ✓ Completed bid evaluation worksheets or matrices;
  - ✓ Explanation for any disqualified bids;
  - ✓ List of people who evaluated the bids
  - ✓ Memos, board minutes, or similar documents related to the service provider selection/award;
  - ✓ Any correspondence with the service providers prior to and during the competitive bidding, evaluation, and award phase of the process

- Comments:
  - Conflict with state/local bidding policies/laws
  - Added burden on school officials
  - Anti-collusion, bid protest processes already in place
- Comments due March 28, but 30-day extension has been requested
